### **Sample Resolution Format**

There are several benefits using the resolution process to adopt rules as opposed to using the simpler process of making motions:

The resolution process provides a thorough, deliberate approach to making rules. It provided consistency in making and wording rules and it is a formal record of all rules made. As a result, the process protects owners form arbitrary board action and the community form charges that could result in inoperable rules.

#### A r

esol	lution contains four sections:
1.)	<b>Authority</b> – This section cite the primary source(s) of a board's authority to make a rule on the topic. Possible sources include statutes, declaration, articles of incorporation, and bylaws. For example:
	WHERAS, the board of directors of Homeowners Association, Inc. is empowered to govern the affairs of the homeowners associations pursuant to Article IX (?) of the bylaws
2.)	<b>Purpose</b> – This section states why a rule is being adopted. For example:
	WHERAS, there is a need to adopt specific rules on parking
3.)	<b>Scope and Intent</b> – This section states who will be affected, for what period of time and the reach and range and extent of the rule. For example:
	WHERAS, it is the intent that this rule be applicable to all owners, tenants, guests invitees, or any other whothis resolution shall remain in effect until otherwise rescinded, modified, or amended by a majority of the board of directors
4.)	<b>Specifications</b> – This section states clearly and completely what those bound by the ruled will be expected to do. For example:
	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the following rules onare herby adopted by the board of directors.
